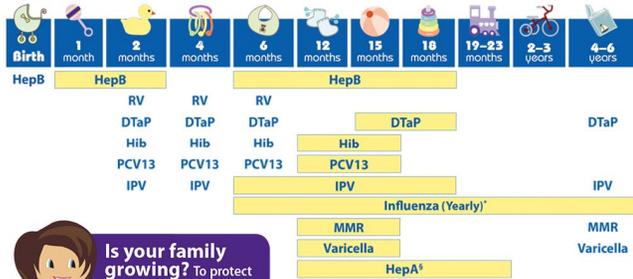
Vaccines are important during every stage of life.

Is your family growing? To protect your new baby and yourself against whooping cough, get a Tdap vaccine. The recommended time is the 27th through 36th week of pregnancy. Talk to your doctor for more details.

Shaded boxes indicate the vaccine can be given during shown age range.

WHAT IS WIC?

WIC stands for Women, Infant & Children. WIC is a nutrition program that provides healthy foods, nutrition and health education and other services to Kansas families who qualify.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF WIC?

- Personalized nutrition counseling and support
- Breastfeeding support
- Referrals for health care & social services

WHO'S ELIGIBLE?

WIC serves Kansas residents who are:

- Pregnant
- Breastfeeding mothers, up to baby's first birthday
- Non-breastfeeding mothers, up to six months after baby's birth
- Infants and children under five years old

FAMILY PLANNING & REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH

The Reproductive Health and Family Planning program assists individuals and couples in planning the number and spacing of their children. Programs are voluntary and confidential.

Services are provided at low or no cost, based on a sliding fee scale. Proof of household income is required.

SERVICES INCLUDE:

- Annual well-woman exam
- Pregnancy testing, counseling, and referral
- Basic infertility services
- Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs) testing/treatment
- Pap tests
- Breast cancer screenings
- Birth control, including natural family planning and abstinence
 - Birth Control Available:
 - Depo Injection (Subcutaneous and/or Intramuscular)
 - Oral Contraceptives Pill
 - Condoms

OTHER SCREENINGS FOR:

- Blood pressure
- Alcohol, tobacco, and other substance use
- Depression and anxiety
- Domestic violence and human trafficking

WHAT IS PUBLIC HEALTH?

Public health promotes and protects the health of people and the communities where they live, learn, work, pray and play.

Public health protects and improves communities by: preventing epidemics and the spread of disease; promoting healthy lifestyles for children and families; protecting against hazards in homes, work, communities and the environment; assuring high quality health care services; and preparing for and responding to emergencies. There is little of daily life not related to or influenced by public health.

Public health is everywhere.

The 10 Essential Public Health Services describe the public health activities that all communities should undertake:



1. Monitor health status to identify and solve community health problems
2. Diagnose and investigate health problems and health hazards in the community
3. Inform, educate, and empower people about health issues

4. Mobilize community partnerships and action to identify and solve health problems
5. Develop policies and plans that support individual and community health efforts
6. Enforce laws and regulations that protect health and ensure safety
7. Link people to needed personal health services and assure the provision of health care when otherwise unavailable
8. Assure competent public and personal health care workforce
9. Evaluate effectiveness, accessibility, and quality of personal and population-based health services
10. Research for new insights and innovative solutions to health problems

CLINIC SERVICES

- Allergy Injections (Patient Provides Allergy Serum via Allergist)
- Blood Lead Screening
- Blood Pressure Screening
- Disease Investigation - Reportable Diseases in Kansas
- Drugs Screens (Employer provides testing kit.)
- Hemoglobin Screening
- Immunizations (Infants, Children, Adults)
- Injections (Patient's Own Medication)
- Physicals – Daycare, School, and Kan-Be-Healthy. (No Sports Physicals)
- Sexually Transmitted Infections (STIs) testing/treatment
- TB Skin Testing (Patient must be able to return 48-72 hours after injection)

The Pratt County Health Department bills insurance companies including Medicaid for services rendered. If you do not have insurance, payment arrangements can be made.
